



Accomplishments

General

- Programmatic reach expanded to encompass the entire country (see map on p. 3)
- Intensive project started in Solola in partnership with the non-profit, Vivamos Mejor

Family Planning

- New long-term, reversible method, Jadelle, offered at mobile clinics - 1,386 administered
- 349 family planning education talks delivered - reaching 10,092 people
- 5.63% of attendees referred immediately for family planning services
- 23.4% increase in knowledge gained from attendance at talks
- 62,157 Couple Years Protection (CYP) provided
- Cost per CYP: \$2.66

CYP

An international standard measure, representing the total number of years of contraceptive protection provided by all methods WINGS has provided, without bias towards any particular method. For each method, the CYP is calculated by taking the number of units distributed and dividing that number by a factor representing the number of units needed to protect a couple for 1 year.

Institutional Strengthening

- Development of program statistics database
- Creation of 3-year Strategic Plan
- Full cost-analysis of services provided
- Formal evaluation of Youth WINGS project
- New religious leaders and men's programs developed
- Hiring of Office Manager, Accountant, Outreach Educator, Youth Educator and Fund-raising Officer
- Staff training sessions including program development and evaluation
- Rental of additional office space providing 4 new offices and donation of new cervical cancer equipment. Expansion of office space to accommodate current program activities

Cervical Cancer

- New VIA/Cryo detection and treatment method offered at all WINGS mobile clinics
- 4,877 women screened for cervical cancer (30.5% for the first time)
- 127 women required and received follow up treatment
- 48 cervical cancer education talks delivered to 1,696 people
- 3.57% of women under 50 not currently using a family planning method referred to services

Youth WINGS

- 36 new youth peer-educators fully trained through WINGS' youth program
- 1,180 youth education talks delivered to 7,414 people (59% young men)
- 71 current youth promoters supported with new materials and resources
- 782 teenagers reached through in-school reproductive health education talks covering 5 hour-long modules: sexual education and responsibility; family planning methods; sexually transmitted infections; anatomy; self esteem and leadership

External Capacity Building

- Support of 21 NGO partners through training and sharing of program materials
