

Dear friends

As we reflect on 2022, we are pleased to see how much momentum we gained during the first full year with a lessening of COVID restrictions and a new Executive Director at the helm of WINGS. We reactivated clinical services to near pre-pandemic levels and reinitiated the high-growth strategic plan that was paused since early 2020. For the previous two years, our tubal ligation services were heavily reduced due to difficulty accessing partner hospitals and we were encouraged by growing that service back to pre-pandemic levels. By working alongside valuable hospital partners, we began to address the significant, accumulated demand for tubal ligation services and performed 34% more tubal ligation operations than projected.

Throughout 2022, the entire WINGS team made significant strides towards our goal of having national presence by the end of 2025. The connections we strengthened include innovations and improvements in clinical services, expanding our Community Advisory Board and Youth Peer Education Program, all while staying ever focused on our commitment to provide quality rights-based, patient-centered reproductive health care and education.

Throughout this report, you'll notice a connective thread. In Guatemala as in many other parts of the world, a red string is worn to ward off misfortune, protecting the wearer against the evil eye. This hilo rojo also connotes an unending, if sometimes invisible, connection that we all have with others in our community. This visual serves as a reminder as we reflect on the challenges and successes of 2022; a reminder of our trust that we are all connected and protected, bound to one another by a shared belief in the power of reproductive health to improve lives.

About WINGS



We take a holistic approach to reproductive health that recognizes the diverse barriers to exercising rights at the local level and engages community members, including indigenous women and girls, to secure reproductive rights and bring their voices to the forefront of the decision-making process. Working in predominantly rural, indigenous, and low-income communities in Guatemala, we provide education and services through a network of Youth Leaders, volunteer health promoters, mobile units, and stationary clinics.





Service Provision



In 2021, WINGS celebrated our 20th year anniversary, giving us the opportunity to reflect on our many milestones over two decades. We are proud that so many of our staff members have been with WINGS for large portions of these 20+ years. We would love for you to get to know four of our longest-standing team members who have all been with us since late 2011/early 2012.

Julia Mercedes Morales Juárez, our Director of Human Resources began her career at WINGS as a receptionist. Over the past decade, she regularly took on new challenges, moving into greater areas of responsibility every few years and recently completed her Master's Degree in Human Resource Management and Development. She has strategically built our HR department so that we are well-positioned to grow into national presence in the next three years.

Marfa Ibett Castillo Samayoa, WINGS' general accountant, is one of the members of the Finance Department who assures that WINGS meets both Guatemalan and US accounting requirements. She participated in the 2022 cohort of El Colectivo, a collaborative with three other nonprofits that promotes Guatemalan women's leadership in local NGOs. Marfa's leadership skills and continued focus on improving English proficiency will open doors for her continued professional growth well into the future.

Ana Lucía González González, our Community Programs Coordinator, started as a member of our promotions team after serving as a Youth Leader in her teens. And now supervises all WINGS youth programming, our Volunteer Promoter Network, and our Community Advisory Boards. She was instrumental in WINGS' Youth Program being certified and accredited by the Guatemalan Ministry of Education as a provider of Comprehensive Sexuality Education.

Luis Alberto Vivar Cajtij initially began as a per diem driver with us, moving into a full-time driver for our mobile unit team in 2012. He now serves as our Community Health Promoter for the departments of Escuintla and Sacatepéquez. Many of the photos that you've seen on our Instagram over the years have come from Luis' talented photography skills.

With such institutional memory and depth of expertise, WINGS values these team members who have a collective four decades of experience with us!



In 2022, WINGS hired Erik Pocasangre as our new Programs Director when Eleanor vacated that position to move to the Executive Director role. Erik came to us from SERniña, a partner organization where we worked with Erik through his positive masculinity programming. With a background as an activist and educator in Guatemala, he has led a variety of environmental, development, and quality of life programs for the communities around the Lake Atitlán basin.

Being a new male leadership figure, Erik made a purposeful effort to enter a mostly female team with respect and care, connecting with his team in meaningful and genuine ways. He also embodies postive ways to relate with male coworkers regarding healthy relationships and nuanced masculinity.

With an endlessly adventurous spirit, Erik has been instrumental to WINGS' growth by accompanying our work in regions where we are bringing new services, strengthening our internal lines of command, and aligning communication styles.

We are so fortunate to have Erik as such an integral part of our leadership team and know that we found the right person to step into this role.





Youth Program

2022 was a year of exciting forward motion for the WINGS Youth Peer Education Program. In January, we hired a Youth Educator in the department of Quetzaltenango to launch a cohort in Xela, the second largest city in Guatemala. The Youth Program in Xela has proved an excellent complement to WINGS' well-established service provision in the region.

In order to launch an entirely new program, our team needed to build alliances in the department. The program received a warm reception from PLANEA (Plan Nacional de Prevención de Embarazos en Adolescentes), a national network that brings together key players to address the high rates of adolescent pregnancy in Guatemala. Included in this group were representatives from the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education. Having these two organizations supporting our efforts opened many doors for the team, connecting us to local education centers and medical institutions. Eight Youth Leaders participated as part of Xela's pilot program in 2022, and we are delighted that 25 Youth Leaders were recruited for the 2023 program year. Given the success and needs of the program, we also opened a Youth-Friendly Space in Xela to accommodate in-person adolescent counseling and individual sessions with our Youth Educator.

Differentiated Service

In 2022, we began to train WINGS nursing staff in a counseling methodology specific to youth patients called Differentiated Care for Adolescents (Atención Diferenciada). This youth-centered model of care considers the physical, social, and emotional circumstances unique to youth to better address the risks and needs of our adolescent population. For example, differentiated care includes screening for violence and power dynamics within youth relationships, as well as addressing themes of partner and parent communication. We are committed to providing this training to our growing internal team and partners, ensuring that Guatemalan adolescents receive age-appropriate, rights-based sexual and reproductive health counseling.


